What are the main national measures being taken to reduce GHG emissions / improve energy efficiency in the built environment?	None. Some states such as California have standards.
What are the main national measures being taken to reduce GHG emissions / improve energy efficiency in the transport sector?	Currently, vehicle manufacturers must certify their vehicles to one of the seven emission bins shown in Table 1. Vehicles are tested over the FTP-75 test procedure (the NMOG+NOx limits must be additionally met over the HFET cycle). The standards are applicable to all vehicles, regardless of the fuel type. The federal government is in the process of rolling back these rules, but these rules are currently consistent with California standards.

What are the main national measures being taken to reduce GHG emissions / improve energy efficiency in the electricity production sector?	By Executive Order on March 28, 2017, the Administration ordered a review of the Clean Power Plan, which had been stayed by the courts. USEPA requested comments pursuant to the Executive Order and issued a response to comments on October 25, 2017 and indicated it would promulgate new rules, which are expect in 2021.

Litigation

Are there prominent national climate change litigation cases in your country? If so please provide a short description (e.g. plaintiffs/defendants, public or civil law based, etc.).

Yes. A court in New York found against by the State of New York against ExxonMobil after trial in which the State of New York alleged prior knowledge of the climate effects of burning hydrocarbons. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts also recently sued ExxonMobil alleging it had failed to disclose the impacts of climate change on its business to investors. NGOs have also sued ExxonMobil and Shell alleging failure to disclose the effects of sea-level rise on facilities.
